"Spotlight On" Red Mountain Trap and Skeet Club - Scottsdale, AZ

This issue we'd like to move West to spotlight the Red Mountain Trap and Skeet Club located in Scottsdale, Arizona. The club, which was originally named the Beeline Trap

and Skeet Club opened in the mid-1960's. In 1991, the club was sold and the new owner's changed it's name to Red Mountain Trap and Skeet. On February 13, 1993, a fire destroyed the club's facilities and later that year new facilities were constructed across the highway and it reopened on December 7, 1993. The club is currently owned and operated by the Salt River Pima - Maricopa Indian Community. It is the only club in the United States owned by an Indian Community to throw registered clay targets. The gun club offers something for everyone! Shooters can take part in registered shooting in skeet and trap; participate in fun shoots and shoot sporting clays. Unlike most gun clubs, they also offer lessons by appointment for newer shooters in all the disciplines. Currently Red Mountain has thirteen (13) program trapfields for year round use. They include

an international Wobble Trapfield; automatic trap doubles field; six skeet fields and a sporting clays and five stand layout.

All of Red Mountain's fields are fully lighted for night shooting during the winter and on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights. Available in the spacious clubhouse is a full line Pro Shop, with everything a shotgun shooter would need - from ammunition, reloading accesories; shooting accesories to cloathing supplies -

Red Mountain Trap and Skeet also has one hundred twenty two (122) RV Spaces with full hookups for those who want to participate in any of their

numerous shoots and events throughout the year. When we visited the facility in March, there were numerous RV's parked at the gun club - all "Snowbirds" that came to Arizona for the winter to shoot trap and enjoy the weather.

Open the entire year, Red Mountain Trap and Skeet truly offers "safe, friendly and fun clay target shooting for the whole family". For those local businesses or groups looking for an outing, Red Mountain offers very affordable "corporate shoot" packages for any of the clay target disciplines. All you need to do is call them and set a date.

Managed by Jennifer Mennetti, Red Mountain Trap and Skeet continues to be one of the top shooting facilities in the West. Assisted by Asst. Manager, Dennis, not only are the grounds immaculate but they make you feel welcome each and every time you come out to shoot.

Conveniently located just beyond the foothills of Red Mountain on the Beeline Highway, the facility is easily reached from all over the Phoenix Metro area. Next time you are in the area we recommend you stop by and shoot a bit.

White Flyer Support Benefits Youths at National Trap Shooting Event

White Flyer Support Benefits Youths at National Trap Shooting Event NEWTOWN, Conn. More than 1,000 youths from around the country showcased their competitive shooting skills under a national spotlight last year thanks in large part to the assistance and generosity of White Flyer.



The National Shooting Sports Foundation's (NSSF) Scholastic Clay Target Program (SCTP) drew more than 200 teams and 1,100 young athletes who displayed their talents at the Grand American World Trapshooting Championships held Aug. 12-13, 2004 in Vandalia, Ohio.

White Flyer provided more than 200,000 clay targets for the national youth competition, a value exceeding \$12,000. "Generous support like White Flyer's provides our youth with outstanding opportunities to participate in shooting sports and also serves to support the future of our industry", said Cyndi Dalena, NSSF Director of Shooting Sports Development.

White Flyer was recognized for its efforts by NSSF during the SHOT Show, held Jan. 28-31 in Las Vegas. Jack Robertson, NSSF's Manager of Special Events, presented the company with a plaque.



NSSF's Scholastic Clay Target Program provides school-age participants in grades 12 and under with the opportunity to showcase their competitive shooting skills and earn state and national recognition. The program is designed to instill in participants safe firearms handling, commitment, responsibility, leadership and

teamwork. The program is a cooperative effort between NSSF, the firearms industry's largest and most diverse trade association with 2,200 members, and the governing bodies for trapshooting, skeetshooting and sporting clays shooting — the Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA), the National Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA) and the National Sporting Clays Association (NSCA), respectively.

The president Lee Bachman and vice-president Doug Sims are very competitive 27yrd trap shooters and also sit on the state board. Jim Tingstad is the president of the AZ Skeet Association. Tim Miles, who once owned Coyote Springs Sporting Clays, comes from the sporting end. Char Prytula shoots, but more importantly knows everything about the inner workings of a tournament. Clyde Thompson runs the innovative and often instantaneous trap scoring computer system. Before I can get my gun wiped down and put away, my score is posted on the overhead monitors for everyone to see.

What more can Tucson offer the shooting public? How about sporting clays, Olympic skeet and international trap? They already have two 5-stands, but they have recently opened a 10 station fully automated course. If that is not challenging enough they have installed a wobble machine to practice international trap.

Tucson is the first club on the west coast to try our new three-quarter style target. Shooters from all of the western states attended the two satellite grand's and were able to see and shoot it for the first time. Since then we have had requests from many other clubs to try it. These targets simply solve the problem that arises when half your shooters prefer the orange dome target and half like the orange top.

2005 Browning, White Flyer, Winchester Ammunition Trap Shoot

The 2nd Browning Arms, White Flyer Targets, Winchester Ammunition Trap Shoot was held February 9 through 13, 2005, at the Silver Dollar Shooters club in Odessa, Florida.

The event was a success with a very large turnout.

This shoot is unique in the respect that three different manufacturing companies got together to sponsor a trapshoot by providing the trophies for the event.

Browning provided a nice selection of both folding and fixed blade knives. Winchester Ammunition provided cases of shotgun shells, and White Flyer donated large Bronzed Eagles as trophies.

Browning also donated a BT99 trap gun to be given away during a handicap event by a lucky number draw. The lucky number drawing is simple. During the handicap event numbers corresponding to the squad numbers are placed in a hat, and one number is drawn. This is the winning squad number. A number from one to five is drawn from another hat and this is the winning post number. The person shooting on the squad and post number drawn wins the BT99.

The shooters were pleased with the format for the gun drawing, as every shooter entering the handicap had an equal chance of winning the gun. This year's winner was a wheel chair shooter from Wisconsin.

The shoot ran very smoothly and the Florida weather cooperated. Sunny skies and temps in the low 80's.

The scores were great and everyone enjoyed the event. The Silver Dollar has a reputation for the professional manner in which they run shoots, and this event was no exception.

There were many compliments on the diversity of the trophies, and Browning, White Flyer and Winchester Ammunition are very proud to be associated with this event.
